For those of you that have been living on Mars for the last few weeks, it will come as an incredible surprise to you to learn that Brownlow Integrated College's one and only Dr. Ronan Blaney, teacher of English, has been nominated not only for a BAFTA, but has been short-listed for

an Oscar (YES, AN OSCAR!) for his short film entitled "Boogaloo and Graham". This is such an incredible achievement and we are all very proud of Dr. Blaney. The film is about two young boys growing up and raising chickens in Belfast in the height of the "Troubles". It was filmed in East Belfast and Dr. Blaney, who wrote the film-script, was also involved in filmíng.

Being nominated for a BAFTA means that Dr. Blaney will have to travel to London to an awards ceremony on the 8th February, where he will be judged alongside four other films in the "Short Film" category. The winner will be awarded the trophy on the night. The awards ceremony will be aired on live TV.

As if that's not enough excitement, Dr. Blaney will then fly to the Oscars award ceremony in LOS ANGELES,

What is a BAFTA?

BAFTA is an acronym for British Academy Film and Television Awards. The BAFTAS take place at the beginning of each year and recognise the best films, actors, music, costumes etc. from

films produced in the previous year. Although they are called the British Academy Awards, they recognise films from around the world.

Who has won an Oscar?

The Oscars (or Academy Awards) are Day-Lewis and the American version of the BAFTAS. Past winners include Cate Blanchett, Meryl Streep, Natalie Portman and Jennífer Lawrence as Best Actresses and

Colín Fírth, Daniel Russell Crowe in the best Actor category. Best Píctures ínclude "The Return of the King" and "Titanic". Dr. Blaney will be mixing with the stars of Hollywood!

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10L Pupils explore integrated and Shared Education at NICIE Stormont Conference

Three pupils from 10L, Maja Ochojska, Andrew Weir and Eoghan McCrory, attended a conference at Stormont in December organised by NICIE. The conference was in the Stormont Hotel, although they were lucky enough to visit Parliament Buildings beforehand.

Pupils from Integrated schools throughout Northern Ireland got together to discuss the merits of Integrated Education and to explore how it differed from Shared Education.

At the moment the government is encouraging schools to become involved in Shared Education, where two or more schools will bring pupils together for a variety of activities, from lessons, sharing equipment or premises, to excursions. will foster understanding between the communities in Northern Ireland.

Whilst it was agreed by pupils that Shared Education has its merits, it was overwhelmingly decided that Integrated Education provides opportunities

to make lasting and meaningful friendships outside of a child's community, to ask about and explore each others differences and similarities in a safe environment and to value each other as people.

Pupils then had the chance to express their conclusions to members of the Education Committee. Below are the views of some members of IOL on the importance of Integrated Education:

"If we use Shared Education we're not telling people that it's OK to be different."

" We learn to be OK about people being different to us."

" With Shared Education you might get to meet different types of people but you don't really get to know them."

"At BIC you talk every day, not just once a week."

"At BIC People will treat you the same, no matter what religion or nationality you are.".

Year 11 Mini-Enterprise December 2014

Our Year 11 Business Studies class took part in the Young Enterprise Company Programme through the first part of their GCSE year.

The class as a whole decided on a viable business idea and invested £15 each, making themselves shareholders in the business and creating start-up capital.

The company became known as Brownlow Enterprise with Darragh Gray as the Managing Director, Bailey Fenner as Finance Director and as a company they had to make key decisions on ordering products, pricing, advertising, division of human resources etc.

The products they sold were a range of festive chocolates from Fosters (the mallow sticks were fantastic!) and personalised canvas bags. Both products exceeded our sales expectations and repeat orders had to be made to keep up with demand.

On December 10th we were invited to the Young Enterprise Trade Fair, where we had the opportunity to sell our products to the public at the Outlet in Banbridge and see what other schools had produced as business ideas. Unfortunately no awards were won but the experience was second to none!

After the trade fair the bills were paid and profit was totalled up. A massive ± 540 was accumulated and spilt between the Shareholders in the business. So for originally investing ± 15 they received ± 36 when the company closed, doubling their original investment through dedication and teamwork ...and a lot of ironing!
