


## Year 8 recall their adventures in Shannaghmore...


New Brownlow Integrated College BFF (Brownlow Friends and Family)


The junior squad (Year 8 to 10) will be playing against Newry High, City of Armagh, Markethill High and Integrated College, Dungannon in their league campaign.

#### School counselling service information

As part of our school Pastoral Care programme, we currently offer counselling to our pupils through Family Works, the Education Authority providers and Barnardo's Time for You service through Extended Schools and the Big Lottery Fund. They help with a range of issues such as

- Bereavement
- Family problems (families separating, illness, conflict)
- Personal and school worries
- Friendship and relationship problems
- Bullying

Our Counsellors are Latifa Lynch (Family Works) and Niamh McCaughley (Barnardos) and they are in school two days a week and are available for referrals which can be made at the request of parents, the pupils and through Mr Callender as Pastoral Care Director. Latifa is in school on a Tuesday and Niamh on a Thursday.

We would encourage any pupil who feels that they need a little support or just a safe space and a friendly face to talk to, to ask for an appointment. All of what goes on in a session STAYS CONFIDENTIAL, unless it is something that we have to act on legally due to our Child Protection procedures.
